




Public Street Resurfacing Project Limits

What To Expect?

- City Commission approved, and was granted a \$7.5 million dollar bond for public street resurfacing.
- Phase 1 includes all public streets bounded by The Florida Turnpike in the West, Powerline Road on the East, Hillsboro Blvd on the south, and the Hillsboro Canal on the North.
- This includes approximately 20 miles of lane resurfacing.
- Project is expected to take 2 months to complete.
- The following letter is being sent to all residents in the affected area. This includes residents on private streets that will be directly affected by this project.
- Be assured that paving and construction techniques used by the City in the past will not be repeated. I have over 30 years of experience directly related to pavement design and construction.
- Describe existing driveway conditions. (Show a properly constructed driveway, an improperly constructed driveway (approximately 30% of existing driveways are constructed this way) and a cracked driveway). Please note that existing cracks will not be repaired.

What To Expect?

 Many mailboxes do not meet code. Mailboxes that extend over the edge of road will impede progress and slow down production.

What to expect?

- Signs will be appropriately located to designate "Street Resurfacing is in Progress".
- On Thursday, 12/13/12 milling operations will commence. 18 inches along the
 edge of each road lane will be milled down about ¾ of an inch. In some cases this
 will include the edge of the concrete driveway in order to correct the deficiencies
 previously identified.
- Prior to laying asphalt, grass at the edge of road will be edged wherever necessary.
- On 12/19/12 we will commence the installation of 1 inch of asphalt on all streets being resurfaced.
- Construction Equipment will be stored at the Villages of Hillsboro Park.
