Subject: How to Install your Irrigation Line through Irrigation Sleeve to the Hillsboro Canal

Your property is near or adjacent to a major waterway operated and maintained by the South Florida Water Management District. The District is a regional governmental agency charged with managing and protecting water resources within a 16-county area. Our mission is to balance and improve water quality, flood control, natural systems and water supply.

To ensure continued flood protection for your community and surrounding areas, the District is undertaking a multi-year effort to stabilize a 10.5-mile section of the Hillsboro Canal, as well as dredging a portion of the canal from the G-56 water control structure (just west of Military Trail) going west for approximately one mile.

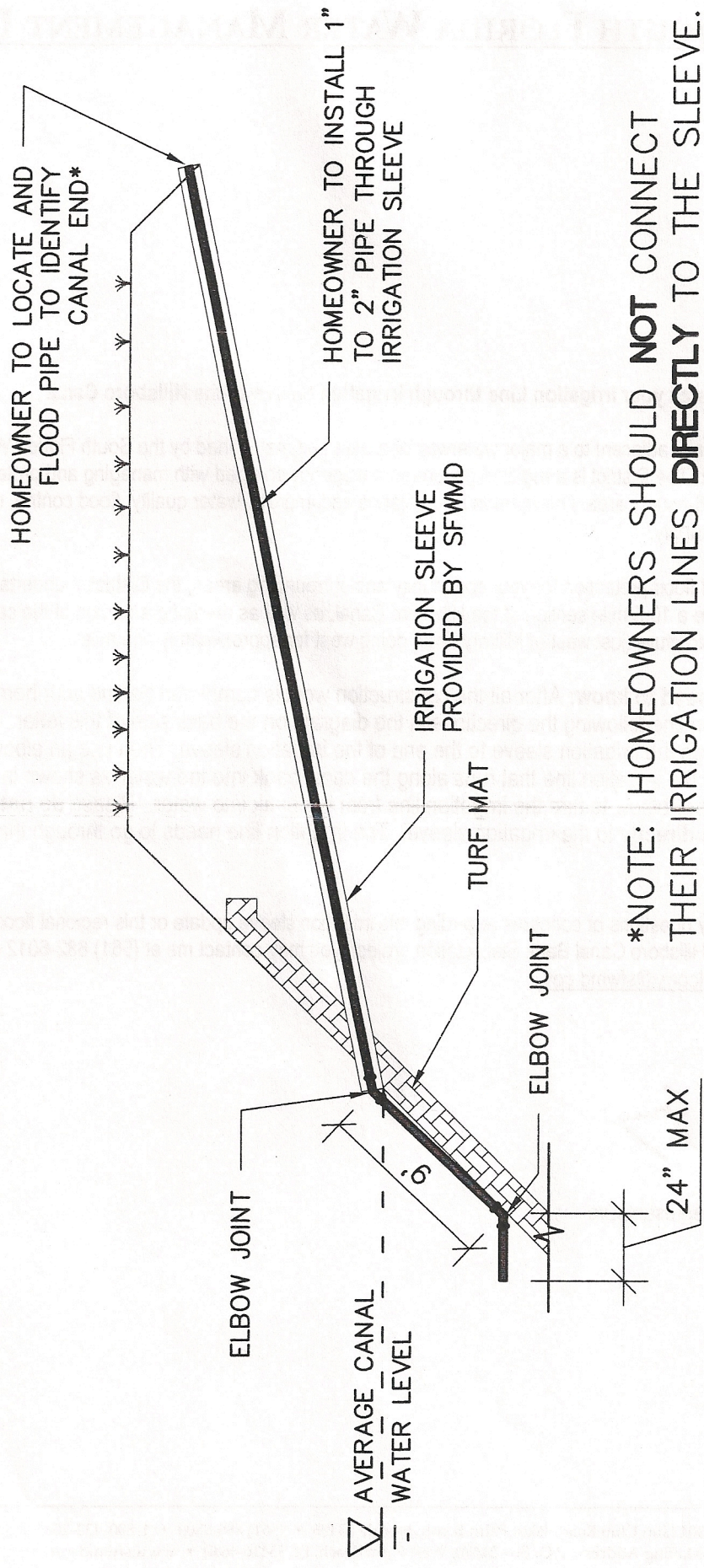
Here's what you need to know: After all the construction work is completed behind your home you may install your irrigation line following the directions in the diagram on the back side of this letter. Install your irrigation line through the irrigation sleeve to the end of the irrigation sleeve. Then use an elbow joint to connect the part of the irrigation line that runs along the canal bank into the water as shown in the diagram. Use another elbow to turn the irrigation line from the bank into water. Please **do not** connect your irrigation lines **directly** to the irrigation sleeve. The irrigation line needs to go through the irrigation sleeve.
