## **SIDEWALKS** TAKE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY

- City of Deerfield Beach code does not allow brick pavers in the sidewalk area of the right-of-way.
- A permit is required for all construction within the public right-of-way, including brick pavers.
- To add pavers in the right of way beyond the sidewalk, a hold-harmless agreement is executed between the homeowner and the City. This agreement clarifies an owner's maintenance responsibility and liability.
- Save yourself from costly re-do's and fines. A licensed contractor should obtain the proper permits. However, as the homeowner, it is your responsibility to ensure all rules and codes are followed.
- The city cannot replace nor pay for any non-standard pavement such as brick pavers, even if damaged by the city during use or work within the right-of-way.
